Clothing Regulations

Players must be attired in correct clothing (i.e. clothing made for badminton, tennis or squash). Beach wear, gym wear and clothing designed and made for other sports is **NOT** acceptable. The following must be adhered to in terms of advertising and lettering where that is present on the shirt. Queensland Badminton will allow the Club name to be substituted for country name so long as the club is an approved affiliated club of a regional or state body affiliated with Badminton Australia. Players presenting for play not correctly attired may be disqualified. State Team uniforms will be permitted.

LETTERING AND SEQUENCE

- lettering to be capital letters in Roman alphabet in single colour contrasting to shirt
- players name to be between 6-10cm height
- country name to be 5cm height
- sponsor or advert name to be maximum 5cm at the back and maximum 10cm in the front.

- the sequence at the back of shirt from top down is players name (if present), country name (if present) and sponsor/advert name (if present).

Combined Age Masters *

Minimum Age to participate in the masters events is 35 years of age as at the date of the tournament. In the combined age events both players ages are added together to determine the category to be played. In these categories 2 x B Grade Masters players can play together. If you are an Open or A Grade player you will need to play with a C Grader or D Grader. Games in Masters events on Saturday 18th July 2015 will be blocked together.

Games in the Under 17 Singles will also be blocked together.

EVENTS TO BE HELD SUNDAY 19th JULY 2015

The Tournament Committee reserves the right to combine events if sufficient entrys are not received. Games in the Under 17 Singles will also be blocked together.



CONDITIONS OF PLAY

- 1. The tournament will be conducted in accordance with the Laws of Badminton adopted by the Badminton World Federation and the Queensland Badminton Association.
- 2. The Tournament Committee reserves the right to amend or add to these conditions as may be necessary and to cancel any event for which there are insufficient entries.
- 3. The Tournament Committee reserves the right to disqualify from any or all events, any player infringing these Conditions of Play or in any way interfering with the conduct of the Tournament.
- 4. Players must report to the Tournament Controller at least 15 minutes prior to the indicated starting time of their match and must play as directed or forfeit the match. Players not ready to play 5 minutes after a match has been called will be defaulted.
- If more than 12 entries (i.e. pairs for doubles events) are received for Singles, Doubles or Mixed in any event (except D Grade) these will also be knockout. Knockout events will be the best of 3 games to 21 using the rally point scoring system. D Grade events will all be conducted as Round Robin events.
- 6. Plate events will be held for all knockout events. Plate matches will be 1 game to 31 points without setting using the rally point scoring system and will all be knockout.
- 7. All Round robin events will be 1 game to 31 points without setting using the rally point scoring system.
- 8. In order to play in D Grade you must be graded D Grade by the Qld Badminton Association Inc or by an affiliated Regional Association/Club or another State Association. All new players (if ungraded) will need to have a grade assigned by your Regional Association/Club.
- 9. In A/B grade events, two A Graders are not permitted to play together and in C/D two C graders are not permitted to play together. If entering in Combined events (Open and A grade players are required to play with C grade players, two B Grade players can enter together). Masters Singles events will have a penalty applied (Open and A grade players will be give B and C graders a 7 points start).
- 10. Combined Age Masters: Minimum Age to participate in the masters events is 35 years of age as at the date of the tournament. In the combined age events both players ages are added together to determine the category to be played. In these categories 2 x B Grade Masters players can play together. If you are an Open or A Grade player you will need to play with a C Grader or D Grader. Games in Masters events on Saturday 18th July 2015 will be blocked together.
- 11. Finals will only be conducted where there are 2 or more groups in an event.
- 12. **Tournament grade shuttles** will be used exclusively throughout the Tournament.
- 13. Players MUST act as umpire or line judge when called upon to do so. Failure to comply with this condition renders the player liable to disqualification.
- 14. Clothing Regulations Players must be attired in correct clothing (i.e. clothing made for badminton, tennis or squash). Beach wear, gym wear and clothing designed and made for other sports is NOT acceptable. The following must be adhered to in terms of advertising and lettering where that is present on the shirt. Queensland Badminton will allow the Club name to be substituted for country name so long as the club is an approved affiliated club of a regional or state body affiliated with Badminton Australia. Players presenting for play not correctly attired may be disqualified. State Team uniforms will be permitted.
- 15. LETTERING AND SEQUENCE
 - lettering to be capital letters in Roman alphabet in single colour contrasting to shirt
 - players name to be between 6-10cm height
 - country name to be 5cm height
 - sponsor or advert name to be maximum 5cm at the back and maximum 10cm in the front.
 - the sequence at the back of shirt from top down is players name (if present), country name (if present) and sponsor/advert name (if present).
- 16. Tracksuits may be worn during warm up period, but may not be worn during a match.
- 17. All players must be registered with the Queensland Badminton Association or through another State Association. Proof of registration may be requested.
- 18. Players may enter their own Grade or higher. Grades are determined by the Queensland Badminton Association or the other Australian State Association. If in doubt, check with your local association.
- 19. Entry Fees are to be lodged when the entry form is lodged, otherwise the entry will be refused. All entry fees must be received within two working days of the closing date. Telephone entries will not be accepted.
- 20. If the Tournament is interrupted for any reason (power failure etc.) the Tournament Committee reserves the right to postpone any or all events until such time or date they consider suitable, or to abandon matches or events.



- 21. Refunds of entry fees are at the sole discretion of the Tournament Committee. **NO** refunds will be made after the draw has been published, except where the Tournament or event is abandoned and then, only at the discretion of the Tournament Committee
- 22. ALL decisions of the Referee (or the responsible official for the time being) are FINAL.
- 23. Warm up time will be limited to (3) minutes per match.
- 24. Local conditions: It will be a fault if, in play, the shuttle hits the roof or other part of the hall structure.
- 25. Players are limited to a Maximum of 6 events and may play no more than 3 events scheduled to be played on the one day. Players are limited to playing across two grades. Players may play in their grade or one higher. If playing 6 events one event must be singles.
- 26. By entering this event, the player hereby agrees and acknowledges that other players, coaches, managers, supporters, spectators, the organisers, administrators and any other person, shall have the right to: photograph and/or record on video all and any games or practice conducted during the course of the event, retain such photographs or video recordings for their own use of whatsoever nature, distribute such photographs or video recordings to any other party, display such photographs or video recordings during the event or any time thereafter, in any form whatsoever (including, but not limited to: promotional displays of the organisers and at any similar event, social network internet sites, the website(s) of the Queensland Badminton Association PROVIDED THAT no such photographs or video recordings shall be used or retained for any illegal immoral or unseemly use or purpose.
- 27. Anti-Doping Information Badminton players in this tournament may be subject to <u>In Competition</u> drug testing. Badminton players, coaches, officials and administrators of this tournament are subject to the Badminton Australia Anti-Doping Policy which has been endorsed by each State/Territory Association. 28. Medications

Some medications contain prohibited substances. If a player suffers from a medical condition which can only be treated by medication containing a prohibited or banned substance, they must get approval to use this medication.
